The Wisdom Box

Using Stances To Make Contact

Making contact is an important concept and requirement in the Satir Model. While others talk about rapport, Satir emphasizes making contact.

As healthy care requirements expect us to reduce the time we see our clients, the time spent making contact with our clients can definitely be reduced. Making contact with our clients can probably be done in the first four minutes of our first session and, then, sustained throughout the following therapeutic sessions.

By using the Satir Personal Iceberg and immediately appraising the client's likely coping stance, the therapist can use the following ways to make deeper and faster contact.

Clients who basically use **placating** as their stance can be easily reached through their feelings.

Clients who basically use **blaming** as their stance can be easily reached through their expectations.

Clients who basically use **super-reasonable** as their stance can easily be reached through their perceptions.

Clients who basically use **irrelevance** as their stance are difficult to reach. Body sensations, body contact, and physical activities are three ways to start making contact with the irrelevant client. Therapists need to take extra time with these clients to make contact before much, or any, change can be worked on.

Knowing the Personal Iceberg and using process questions will greatly reduce time needed to make contact with your clients.
