XII World Family Therapy Conference— Oslo, Norway

What do you get when 1500 people from 64 countries descend on the city of Oslo, Norway, for five days in June to learn about family therapy together? Stimulation, growth, excitement and fun!

This year the *International Family Therapy Association* held their annual conference in Oslo, and it seemed to be a great success. For five days we heard from researchers and therapists from around the world.

Highlights for me included: David Epston from New Zealand who demonstrated a creative and effective therapy session with a 10 year old boy; Jaakku Seikkula, a psychiatrist from Finland who spoke about his work with psychotic patients in terms of helping them process (in a very Satir-like way) the terror which cannot be spoken (he has reduced hospitalization so dramatically that he is in danger of having mental health services funding cut); E. Vrono from Russia who presented research on the factors of mothers of suicidal children; and Scott Miller from the U.S. who wowed John with his analysis of 40 years of outcome research to find what works in therapy.

Satir was represented by Martin

Bartel who did a session on "Satir & Spirituality" and my workshop on Working with Children and Families using the Satir Model.

We each had an audience of about 200 people in the second largest meeting room at the conference and had very good feedback.

There was also a triad from the Czech group John and I have been working with for the past three years, Olga Holobova, Milada Radosova and Larka (a grad student) on their use of Satir's family reconstruction process to heal the wounds of

their cultural history. John attended their workshop and was very impressed with their presentations.

Once again, we were very aware that many of the people we have in our Satir Institute would have presented workshops at a much higher level than many of the presenters we saw. I would strongly urge any of you to submit a proposal to present a Satir workshop at the next IFTA conference, scheduled to take place in November 2001 in Brazil. We plan to and we hope you will join us there.

The Evolution of Psychotherapy Conference: Who's Who Anyway?

When nine members of the Satir Institute of the Pacific leave the country to attend the same event, something important must be happening.

Every five years since 1985, the Milton Erickson Foundation has sponsored the Evolution of Psychotherapy Conference. It brings together the founders and leaders of psychotherapy and family therapy to share with 5,000-7,000 professionals from around the world the old and the new in therapeutic evolution.

At the conference, we met and heard people like Alexander Lowen, founder of bioenergetics, Salvador Minuchin, founder of Strategic Family Therapy, as well as:

Aaron Beck, Cognitive Therapy; Albert Ellis, Rational Emotive Therapy;

Eugene Gendlin, Focusing; William Glasser, Reality Therapy:

Mary Goulding, Transactional Anaylsis;

Jay Haley, Strategic Family Therapy;

Thomas Szasz, Myth of Mental Illness;

E & M Polster, Gestalt Therapy; Zerka Moreno, Psychodrama; Irvin Yalom, Existential Therapy; James Bugantal, Humanistic Therapy.



Add to this the familiar list the likes of:

John Gottman, Research on couples and families; Claudia Black, Addictions

Treatment; Francine Shapiro, EMDR;

Bert Hellinger, Family Constellation;

Herbert Benson, Relaxation Response; Jeff Zeig, Ericksonian Therapy and many, many more. It made the choices of who to see and hear more than a dilemma.

It was great to meet, once again, so many founding leaders, even though some of them like Carl Rogers, R.D. Laing, Virginia Satir, Carl Whitaker, Lewis Wolberg, Murray Bowen and Joseph Wolpe have passed beyond and were missing from this 2000 conference.

In addition to the historical value, many presenters added to my therapeutic understanding. I found Francine Shaprio, Jeff Zeig, Bert Hellinger and Eugene Gendlin the most valuable to my therapeutic learning. James Hillman, author of *The Soul's Code*, shared with us some provocative, challenging, illuminating throughts about the external and internal worlds in which we live and practice therapy.

Researcher John Gottman, author of *Why Marriages Succeed* and Fail and numerous other

books, provided us elegantly with many research findings that have had great impacts on our couples and family therapy practice.

And, like in politics, some big names are only big names, offering very little. To check with them about their experiences and learnings, call on Alan Baiss, Beth Lisson, John Riopka, Don Potkins, Wendy Lum, Anne Morrison, Deborah Fish, and/or Kathlyne Maki-Banmen.

Euro 2000

"Off to Slovakia" was truly a highlight of my Europe itinerary. Having accompanied John and Kathlyne to the Czech Republic in 1998 introduced me to a wonderful group of Satir therapists working with exceptional commitment in developing their own personal and professional skills throughout these two countries. It was with the fond memories of acquired friendships and my own personal development as a Satir therapist that I was filled with excitement and enthusiasm in accompanying John & Kathlyne once again.

Vienna, Austria was the destination where I met John and Kathlyne several hours later to be taken by car to the small community of Stupave, just outside of Bratislava, Slovakia. Time went by quickly which resulted in continued dialogue with may participants throughout the conference.

It was also a time to meet familiar faces from the previous years in Dusseldorf, Germany and in Akron, Ohio. Some cultural experiences added to the memories such as being downtown the night that Norway beat Spain in the Euro 2000 soccer championships, attending an evening of organ music in the famous Oslo Cathedral, and an evening boat cruise in the har-

Training For Trainers Program
