Upcoming Special Event—February 24, 2001 Therapeutic Explorations Workshop

This special event is a first in a series of workshops sponsored by the *Satir Institute of the Pacific* which will compare the Satir Method with another therapeutic approach focusing on a specific issue.

This particular workshop will focus on trauma through comparing the Satir Model with an Eriksonian approach.

Dr. Brian Pound who is a physician and hypnotherapist with 40 years experience will explore the issue of trauma through the Eriksonian methodology.

Stephen Smith who is a family therapist and addictions counselor will present this issue through the Satir Model.

Participants will be given practi-

cal tools for working with clients in the area of trauma. The format will include a lecture/demonstration/experiential component by each presenter and then there will be a discussion comparing the two approaches. It is open to professionals working in the field and students.

News Around the Institute

Members of the Satir Institute of the Pacific — Suicide Intervention & Treatment Task Force, Judy Ferris, Wendy Lum and Jim Smith completed a successful presentation at the Canadian Association for Suicide Prevention 11th Annual Conference. Their workshop was entitled "What Kids Are Teaching Us."

There were approximately 100 people in attendance. They looked at the internal world of adolescent suicides from a coroner behavioural investigator's experience. Also highlighted was the importance of building resiliency (strengths and resources) within the family and community.

Judy, Wendy and Jim are also

authoring an article for the Contemporary Family Therapy Journal on suicide for the September 2001 issues. Be sure to check it out next year!

The Ministry For Children and Families Simon Fraser Region's staff conference will be highlighting Satir Trained leaders of workshops on November 7 & 8, 2000. Anne Morrison will be the keynote speaker! The theme for the conference is Renewal, Revitalization and Connecting. It will be held over 2 days and the expected audience will be 340 MCF workers (from Burnaby to Maple Ridge).

The following members that have completed the Satir Training for Trainers Program will be presenting: Sandy Ang on unmet expectations; Anne Morrison and Wendy Lum on inner and outer wellness; Don Potkins and Steve Smith on adolescent addictions.


