Message from the President



I am excited to share with you that the Satir Institute of the Pacific has launched a major new project. We have just issued a call for

papers for the inaugural issue in August 2006 of a new Satir academic journal. Dr. Steven Bentheim is the Editor and Dr. Jesse Carlock the Associate Editor. There are also Assistant Editors around the world. Details of the call for papers can be found at a new website

The Satir Institute of the Pacific's intention is to provide an international forum for academic discourse and research on the Satir Model. Other material related to the Satir Model will also be accepted.

I hope we can all do what we can to make this important initiative a success and that it will enhance the importance of the Satir Model in the academic world as well as amongst all those who practice the model personally and professionally.

The first weekend of February your Board of Directors gathered together for a two-day retreat at Westminster Abbey in Mission (story & photos p. 4). We began with Anne Morrison leading us in a team building exercise that set the tone for the remainder of the weekend. We reaffirmed the Institute's Vision and Mission Statements.

The Vision Statement is:

- We are a welcoming, intentional community committed with energy and passion to growth, change and transformation.
- We create a foundation of mutual trust build on love, honesty, support and inclusivity.
- We offer an affirming environment which releases wonder, creativity and connection to the universal source and divine wisdom.
- We are committed to personal responsibility, congruence, and integrity in the development of individual wisdom and leadership.
- We embody and promote these principles and concepts to achieve a world of harmony, peace and wholeness within, between and among all humanity.

The Mission Statement describes our purposes that guide all our activities and can be found in our Constitution.

We developed our draft three-year plan from 1st April 2006 to 31st March 2009 and will continue in the next Board Meetings to finish it and then share the highlights with the membership. We also looked at how to position the organization to support our current activities and the major new projects we are undertaking with the launch of the Journal, and the partnerships with Douglas College and the Phoenix Centre.

Professional membership shall include the following:

- a) Persons having received a minimum of 120 hours of approved Satir training;
- b) Persons applying Satir knowledge and skills in their workplace;
- c) Persons who are interested in furthering the purposes and objectives of SIP and who identify personally with the Satir Model.

Clinical membership shall include all of the following:

- a) Persons having received a minimum of 120 hours of approved training in the Satir Model;
- b) Persons possessing a graduate degree in psychology, counseling, social work, nursing, medicine or a related profession;
- c) Persons who belong to a provincial or national professional organization or association approved by the Board of Directors of SIP such as:
 - i. British Columbia Association for Marriage and Family Therapy
 - ii. Canadian Guidance and Counseling Association
 - iii. British Columbia Association of Clinical Counsellors
 - iv. British Columbia Association of Social Workers
 - v. Registered Nurses Association of British Columbia
 - vi. Registered Psychiatric Nurses Association of British Columbia
 - vii. College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia
 - viii. College of Psychologists of British Columbia
 - ix. Or similar membership in other geographical jurisdictions
- d) Persons who are involved on a regular basis in the practice, direction, instruction or research in the field of therapy and counseling;
- e) Persons who are interested in furthering the purposes and objectives of SIP, and who accept the Satir Model as their primary professional therapy model.

N.B. To retain professional and clinical membership, members will be required to show evidence of at least 60 hours of relevant continuing education over each three-year period of membership.

Affiliate membership (open to students) shall include all of the following:

- a) Persons having received a minimum of 60 hours of Satir training;
- b) Persons who are interested in furthering the purposes and objectives of SIP;
- c) Persons who are interested in supporting the development and use of the Satir Model.

Training for Trainers Program

Dear Satir Institute Members:

The Satir Institute of the Pacific is planning to offer a Training-for-Trainers program for Clinical and Professional members in July 2006. The purpose of the training is to develop a cadre of people willing and able to offer Satir Model-based training programs in B.C. and around the world.

This residential training program will be held from July $6^{\text{th}} - 11^{\text{th}}$, 2006 in Surrey, B.C. The training program will focus on 1) training and teaching skills, and 2) on group process skills. The training program will also develop curricula for a variety of possible training programs to be offered by the training participants. During the training program, participants will work in dyads on curriculum development and training practice.

The whole Training-for-Trainers program will consist of three phases:

- 1. Residential Training Program: July 6th 11th, 2006
- Each participant or dyad running a minimum of a two-day or two- one-day (or equivalent) training program(s) during the following 12 months.
- A three-day residential or non-residential follow-up training program in the summer of 2007.

Applicants for this program will be skilled in the application of the Satir Model and have a keen desire and interest in training others in using the Satir Model in specific or numerous focuses. We include a short list of possible focus programs which might be offered by graduates of this training program on behalf of the Satir Institute, or independent of the Institute.

It appears that programs are more successful if they are focused on a particular area of concern. Therefore, the list is more "problem based." The following possibilities come to mind:

- 1. Training alcohol and drug counsellors.
- 2. Sexual abuse treatment skills.
- Trauma: natural disasters, war, political unrest, etc.
- Play, art, or movement therapy using the Satir
 Model
- 5. Counselling couples, families, children, stepfamilies.
- 6. Suicide prevention & the aftermath of suicide.

- 7. Marriage enhancement groups.
- 8. Pre-marital counselling skills.
- 9. Resolving and healing domestic violence.
- 10. Depression: individuals, groups.
- 11. Parenting groups.
- 12. Team building groups.
- 13. Mental illness therapy skills.
- 14. Etc., etc., the list could be much longer.

This list is only to give you some examples of possibilities. Participants will select their own area of focus and interest.

The course leaders and supervisors of the three phases of this program will be John Banmen and Kathlyne Maki-Banmen. The residential training program is highly subsidized by John and Kathlyne who are doing the training for free, and by the Institute which is paying half of the total cost, including both residential and administrative costs.

Therefore, the cost to the participants of the residential program, which will cover room and board, material, administration, and tuition fees, will be approximately \$300.00 to \$350.00 Cdn per participant for the full week.

The Institute Program Committee triad and John Banmen, will select 10 people from the applicants from B.C. We also plan to invite two people from outside of B.C. to participate in this training program.



The Satir Journal will be fully accessible as a website in August of 2006 and in print the following year. We are inviting submissions at this time.

B. Submissions

Fields and **Topics**:

In addition to clinical and counseling psychology, manuscripts are invited from a wide network of fields such as nursing, education, social work, organizational development, public policy, arts, and community development. We invite a wide range of topics that include experiential, cognitive, affective, expressive, transformational, systemic therapy and spirituality.

Categories: - The following are our three main submission categories:

RESEARCH - The mode of inquiry may employ quantitative or qualitative designs, conducted as experimental, hermeneutic, phenomenological or integral methodologies. (APA style, max. 25 pages including references).

INSIGHTS - a brief discourse on theory and applications in the field. These may include client, clinical or training experience, institutional and/or governmental policies, cross-cultural theories and approaches that may impact the client, clinician, society and culture.

ARTS & REVIEWS - Articles, books, art therapy, interviews, etc. connected with Satir's vision.

Specifications: -

- 1. All manuscripts should be double-spaced, using 12 point Times New Roman font where possible on MS Word (or MAC MS Word). Pages should be numbered consecutively, with the title page as page 1 and an abstract of no more than 200 words as page 2.
- 2. Translations for manuscripts in languages other than English are the responsibility of the author.
- 3. The authors name and affiliation should appear on page 1, with home and work telephone numbers and email address.
- 4. Research manuscripts should conform to the style specified in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 5th Edition* and should not exceed a maximum of 25 pages, including references.
- 5. If the manuscript is based on dissertation research, or a funded project, a note on the title page should provide the relevant facts.
- 6. Graphics should be submitted in high-resolution digital format.
- 7. Submit the electronic copy of your manuscript to submissions@satirjournal.com. Manuscripts should not be submitted simultaneously to other journals. Generally, we will let you know in sixty days if your manuscript is suitable for our journal.



What is a Family Reconstruction?

Family reconstruction is a process by which the client, sometimes called the "star", has the opportunity to re-experience the impact of her family of origin in order to find the strengths and resources she learned and inherited, to become aware of the unfinished business she is still carrying and to resolve that impact so that it no longer has a cost for her in the present. The client experiences transformational change so that she not only behaves differently, but has different feelings, perceptions and expectations of herself and her family, is able to fulfill her yearnings in new ways and has more of a connection with her deepest Self.

The interventions used in family reconstruction include the three generational family map, sculpting family members, experiential awareness, accepting what was, changing unmet expectations, reframing perceptions, changing feelings, meeting yearnings, accepting resources, accepting family members, and forgiving self and others. The client's transformation leads to new congruence and freedom.

This is not a workshop about family reconstruction; this is a therapeutic family reconstruction with a client. The client for this day, Dr. Janet Christie-Seely, is working towards more self-acceptance and resolving the impact of specific events from her childhood.

Participants will be invited, on a completely voluntary basis, to participate in the process by representing family members during the family reconstruction process. There will be ample time to process and debrief as a large group after the therapeutic aspect of the day is completed. Many people find that they learn a great deal about their own internal process while experiencing the star's process through the day.
