# World Family Conference — Prague, Czech Republic, May 2007

Organizing Committee - Conference Opening

Here I was in Prague with 350 delegates from all over the World who came together to celebrate the 90<sup>th</sup> birthday of Virginia Satir. My husband and I had arrived in Prague early to see some of the city, and we were indeed awed by the incredible beauty of the architecture of the place. It is a jewel within Europe.

On the first day of the conference we were fortunate enough to watch and listen to music



played and sung by the local conservatory. This is the Prague tradition, and a very good one. We were welcomed by all of the organizers of the conference. I saw quite a few faces that I had known from other Satir events, like Intensive trainings over the years.

I realised that this was going to be an exciting event, with people who were coming together for the purpose of celebrating all of the spreading of the wisdom of Virginia Satir.

The conference was a whirlwind of fabulous workshops and talks, all translated into Czech, or English. The organizing committee gave John Banmen an award. We were serenaded twice, one time in the Strahov Monastery. There was a reception at the Mayor of Prague's Residence. Again, the building was indescribably beautiful. I gave my talk on working with the families of children with a diagnosis of ADHD with the Satir model. It was a thrill, and I feel happy and proud that I was given that opportunity. The connecting to old friends and colleagues was wonderful. The Satir community spans the globe and continues to spread thanks to the dedication of people like John and Kathlyne. I will never forget Prague.

# World Family Conference, cont'd ...

The World Family Conference held this May was a jewel in the stunningly beautiful city of Prague. Aside from a seminar I attended with the family therapist, Bosznormenyi-Nagy which I attended some 25 years ago in Montreux, Switzerland, I have never attended a conference set in Europe.

In both instances, the conference amenities were much finer than I have experienced in the U.S. from the warm reception at registration and throughout the conference, the many conference helpers capably guiding attendees and presenters alike, tasty sweets, sparkling mineral water and other goodies at breaks, and fine music sprinkled throughout the proceedings. The gala evening kick off at the magnificent Monastery at Strahov which included an opera soloist accompanied by a guitarist may give you a clue about the elegance of this affair.

I was struck by the attention to detail and the respect and gratitude shown to presenters by our friends from the Czech and Slovak Republics who hosted the conference. Professionals are much more revered than in the U.S.

In addition to the informative and emotionally touching presentations honouring Virginia Satir, Petr Bos, Olga Holubova and Jan Spitz, a wide spectrum of programs was offered to the 350 participants from 34 countries who had gathered for the conference expanding our family to all who attended.

The conference included presentations which covered theory, research, and applications as well as some experiential sessions. Content covered such topics as family violence, war, hospice, multi-disciplinary family care, leadership, addictions, ADD to name a few. Torn by my curiosity about many of the sessions, my desire to explore Prague, and my need to attend to my spouse who was accompanying me, I still managed to attend quite a few sessions.

Karin Tschantz from Switzerland presented a snapshot from her dissertation which is nearing completion. Karin's dissertation covers Virginia Satir's personality, biographical information, as well as her fight for her place in the family ther-

apy arena. She gave a frank yet sensitive account of some of Virginia's personal struggles related to shadows from her family of origin. Being unaccustomed to 20 minute presentations, I left wanting to hear more about Karin's discoveries, many of which matched impressions I gathered as a result of the interviewing I had done in preparation of the DVD I presented last year at the annual Avanta meeting.

The use of metaphors in therapy has always been an interest of mine, so I was excited to attend a session by Dr. Simon Yiu Chuen Lee from the Chinese University in Hong Kong who presented results from his dissertation in which he studied five hours of audio tapes of a clinical interview conducted by Virginia Satir revealing patterns of metaphoric usage and how these metaphors impacted the client.

Being partial to experiential sessions, I especially liked the session entitled "Dance Invivtation" led by Rebeka Trepačová and Olga Namcova from Bratislava, Slovak Republic They used four resources in the Self-Mandala as parts for a truncated Parts Party. I was assigned to Rebeka's small group. What was figural for me was Rebeka's tender facial and hand expressions, her close tracking of her client, her presence, her grace, her warmth. Rebeka's interpreter was also excellent as well. His ability to convey her message, feelings and all, was remarkable and brought home to me the importance of the relationship between the leader and the interpreter, especially in experiential work.

The powerful film I viewed on the subject of searching for a good death which posed questions such as, "Can I die in

harmony with myself?"; "Do I still have a reason to live;" "Should we have a right to end our lives," still stays with me. Through the eyes of dying people and their loved ones, the filmmaker explored the "most profound liberty of all", the right to die.

I was also fascinated by the fine presentation by Dr.Wai-Yung Lee who explored some of the differences she sees in Asian couples as distinct from non-Asian couples through clips from her therapy work with one Chinese family. She pulled out several themes: 1) After marriage, women often have to take care of both their family of origin and their nuclear family, 2) People often marry not for romance but for other reasons. Sometimes marriages are arranged, 3) Divorce doesn't come easily in China. Couples tend to stay together despite little satisfaction, and 4) Couples do not work on building and strengthening their relationships with each other. Evidence regarding whether these observa-

tions can be more broadly substantiated beyond this couple was not presented.


Beyond the presentations though, the mix of people representing so many different cultures added to the richness of this conference. I have only two wishes should there be a third conference: 1) That time be allotted for structured interaction among participants to encourage cross-fertilization of ideas and collaborative work, and 2) That the conference logo and sessions reflect the diversity of contemporary families which is present in parts of the world.

The elegant conference closing reception was held at the Residence of the Lord Mayor of Prague with the music of an instrumental jazz ensemble in the background. What a way to end a momentous occasion.

The World Family Conference in Prague was indeed an excellent experience, but there are hundreds of ways of looking at it, from each participant's pair of eyes. Mine was simply one of them, as a first-timer to Europe, as I carried my case of *Satir Journals* to the conference. Many of us stayed at various hotels or youth hostels and mine was on the other side of town. This put me in high adventure mode, not speaking a word of Czech and needing to cross the city on my own.

#### DAY ONE

When I emerged from the underground Metro subway station into the city center, I looked around me and I couldn't believe my eyes. I was in Renaissance City! Gorgeous human-sized statues were inlaid on the walls of buildings, and guardian angel statues hovered on the roofs. Just below the blue sky, a winged angel at the top of one building may have been where centuries of eyes looked for comfort.

For this year's World Family Conference, honorary president Dr. John Banmen (Canada) and Dr. Ilona Koťátková (Czech Republic) Conference Chair, opened the stage to the others. The conference organizers included Hana Ščibranyová, President of the Virginia Satir Institute of the Slovak Republic, Alexandra Beránková, President of the Virginia Satir Institute of the Czech Republic, Jean McLendon, President of the Virginia Satir Global Network (formerly Avanta), and

Program Chair, Dr. Milada Radosová (Czech Republic). Hopefully the re-telling of our tales can assist somewhat in embracing any of you who could only be with us in your hearts.

The opening ceremony included a string concert with violin, 'cello and piano trio and a brass ensemble. Some workshops addressed extremely difficult issues, including: "Weary of War" with Suzanna Levy (Sao Paulo, Brazil) and "Suffering with Human Rights Violations" with Arturo Roizblatt (Santiago, Chile). They worked in South America with families whose loved ones were taken away by death squads, and who must decide whether or not to grieve or to keep on hoping for their loved ones to return, for some clients after thirty years of waiting. This in itself presented many therapeutic issues.

#### **DAY TWO**

At the Satir Journal table, Dr. Branko Gacic, a Belgrade psychiatrist approached me with his situation of having lived behind the Soviet block. He has written a core of articles and will offer us one.

Later in the morning, Maria Gomori's offered, "The Personality & Work of Virginia Satir: Her Global Legacy." This included biographical insights and a stirring presentation on Satir's use of spirituality in therapy.

The evening offered an entertaining event in the main hall. We were treated to a Czech-gospel-singing group, "Gesham," complete with swaying in a soulfull manner. I happened to be sitting next to Dr. Kate, who reminisced how Aretha's Franklin's father sang back when she had been in her Louisiana church. What a small world!

Evening. I'm back onto the tram. Missed my stop, but figured how to get back to the Metro stop. Bought the Prague Post paper and a sandwich.

#### **DAY THREE**

Jirina Prekopova (Lindau, Germany) treated a packed house to "Tight hug therapy as a chance for restoring love within a family." This warm, matronly German therapist demonstrated the use of full body hugs, and the deep healing that it could bring. Then, Jean McLendon (USA) offered "Congruent Leadership: a Satir construct." If she found herself somewhat distracted with the joking of Stephen Buckbee's trio, (including Daniel Doyle and Michael Dupont), she wisely "went to where the energy was." She then offered a sage diagram of congruent leadership, linking the importance of relationship with doing an administrative task.

The Buckbee trio wanted me to wear their special tie for the big evening event, which was a reception at the Mayor of Prague's residence. Honored by the deputy mayor, Dr. Banmen then offered a toast. Later, our comedy trio offered Dr. Banmen a ceremonial gangster hat and bodyguard, which was respectfully declined.

#### **TOURIST MEMOIRS**

I was hosted on the weekend by a young couple, Katka and Stevo. In the old town center, the giant Tyne church looks like the Disneyland castle. I visited the Spanish-Alhambra synagogue that has huge domes and pillars with mosaics that are explosions of artwork. The Prague castle ground is a palace with gravestones of former kings and knights with a huge church inside. Prague has centuries of overlapping history, and one gets used to walking on the medieval stone streets. The city of Prague is an exceptional place, and the World Family Conference was organized with exceptional care. I offer my thanks to everyone who made this event possible.

As announced in a recent *Wisdom Box* edition, the Satir Institute of the Pacific has begun a STST Level III training program for professionals.

#### **Program Description:**

Over the next 2 years (2007/2008), SIP will offer 8 two-day weekend workshops on a variety of therapeutic topics using the Satir Model. The first weekend, *Suicide Prevention and Treatment* with Dr. John Banmen, took place the weekend of January 28 & 29, 2007. The next weekend, June 9 & 10, 2007, will be *Healing from Trauma* with Kathlyne Maki-Banmen. Tentative subsequent topics include Working with Personality Disorders, Recovering from Loss and Grief, Overcoming Addictions, Working with Eating Disorders and similar DSM IV-R symptoms. As the weekends are confirmed, they will be announced in the Wisdom Box and on the SIP website at www. satirpacific.org.

#### **Program Pre-requisites:**

Although graduates of STST Level I training programs are invited to attend the workshops, in order to receive a STST Level III completion certificate participants must:

- 1. Have successfully completed a STST Level II training program or equivalent (at the discretion of Dr. John Banmen, Director of Training).
- 2. Have a Master's degree or equivalent (or special permission from Dr. John Banmen, Director of Training)
- 3. Complete a **minimum of 5** of the 8 two-day weekend workshops.
- 4. Complete a written case study of one of their client cases dealing with one of the topics from one of the attended workshops.
