John Banmen Abroad in Asia

After reading the <u>Vancouver Sun</u> article about John Banmen's work, I had a chance to meet him shortly after he returned from an eight city, five country trip to Asia. Over lunch he was telling me and Florence (our Membership Director) about some of his experiences.

It looks like the Satir Model is well and expanding in Asia. For example, in Taiwan they are planning their twentieth birthday since Maria Gomori did her first workshop. Their plan is to have 10 monthly special anniversary programs during the year. Their hope is to have Maria Gomori do a special weekend talk, demonstration and workshop. John has already decided the month he will be the special program guest. He followed Maria about two years later and has been there yearly ever since.

In South Korea the Satir Institute of Korea has joined two universities to offer a masters program in Satir Family Therapy. The first of the two universities has had two classes of graduates. Their first class ended with 18 graduates. John teaches the students yearly as part of their course/program requirements.

In Hong Kong Satir Center where they usually have over 90 applicants for 42 places for their two year part time programs is starting an advanced program focusing on couples and family program in 2011. And you guessed it; John will be doing two thirds of the program. The rest will be taught by Marie Lam, winner of the SIP Unsung Hero Award of 2010.

The China scene sounded much more complex. Three Satir Centers are each offering a two year counselor training program. Each program consists of 15 days, five days at a time, about four months apart. Local more advanced professionals provide small group facilitation and triad supervision.

Recently three new Satir Centers were approved by the China Management Center, the China Government approves Satir management organizations. These three centers are and will be offering courses by our own SIP members: Sandy Novak, Anna Low, Linda Lucas, Pauline Chan, Marie Lam, Sok Fun Lam and Stephen Buckbee. Anne Morrison and Gloria Taylor had to withdraw from the China team due to illness.

John hopes Nitza Broide-Miller, Jennifer Nagel and Carolyn Nesbitt will join the team in the near future.

Some courses are of a personal growth nature. Other programs include parenting, couples, communications and parent-teenage relationships.

I hope I captured the basic picture John shared with us at lunch. I really do not remember what I had to eat. I do remember I had to pay for my own lunch. Next time I will take better notes or have him write me a more detailed report.

"DEAD KIDS TALKING – Finding the Internal Story of Suicide and Suicidal Ideation" Using the Satir Transformational Systemic Therapy Model

Jim Smith MA, RCC, RSW (PP) will present his experiences and findings with the BC Coroner's Service where he was employed as a Behavioral Investigator where he investigated completed adolescent suicides, suspected suicides and suspicious deaths that could be suicide.

Jim will share his behavioral investigation procedures and methodology for gathering idiographic information pertaining to a deceased person and will illustrate with case references on how the Satir Transformational Systemic Therapy Model's view of behavior was used to make sense of these seemingly senseless deaths. The Satir Transformational Systemic Therapy Model and the Model's view of suicide will be discussed.

Jim will also discuss how the Satir Model can be used with living youth to understand their deeper unmet needs masked by acting out behaviors where left unresolved can lead to suicidal ideation and suicide.

A Personal Reflection


I began my career as an elementary school teacher in 1998 and started counselling at the elementary level last year after receiving my Masters in Education. During my studies a colleague highly recommended Satir Transformational Systematic Therapy training. Always eager to develop myself professionally, I enrolled in the Satir program this fall. The course has not only helped to advance my professional knowledge and skills but has led to positive personal growth.

The practice of exploring my own iceberg and looking closely at my internal experiences, especially during stressful times, has led to increased self-awareness and understanding of how I interact with others. I have become more cognisant of my coping stances, perceptions, feelings, and expectations and the patterns that have emerged in my reactions to different situations. Applying this new knowledge has helped me to identify and change unhelpful patterns of thinking, feeling and acting. I have realized that there are many possibilities in meeting unmet expectations and fulfilling my yearnings. I am learning to be more mindful and congruent by connecting to my internal resources and spiritual essence through meditation. Increasingly, this has allowed me to feel calm, peaceful, and content in my life.

When I met with my triad to create my family map, I started to make new personal discoveries. These discoveries included how my family dynamics have impacted me and how my decisions about who I am has impacted my relationship with others. I was able to separate each person from their family role and understand how their coping stances influenced relationships and interactions. I had never considered their perspectives in such depth before and this helped me to gain a greater appreciation for who they are.

Professionally, I have started to discover the power in "deep sea diving" with children of all ages

helping them move beyond the story and presented behaviour by looking at their own icebergs. Using this approach has reminded me about the importance of having others separate the person from the behaviour, look at the whole picture, and not judge or assume what is really going on for a child. Children have continued to amaze me with their honesty, willingness, and commitment to internal change. Even in the most challenging circumstances, I have witnessed that change is possible and transformational change not only impacts their own well-being, but also their relationships with others. The positively directional practice of Satir's model is very motivating to me. Satir's basic therapeutic beliefs instil hope in the change process and helps children to overcome problems by discovering and connecting to their internal resources and Self.
