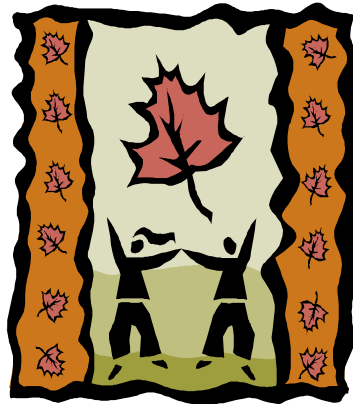

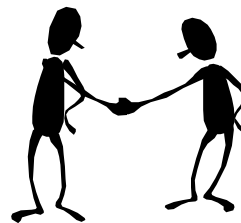

## Personal Reflections on a Day with Ken Cox — by Colleen Murphy and Rick Schneider

On June 8th, 2002, my husband and I attended the Satir Institute's Special Event—*Outer & Inner Space Explorations* with Dr. Ken Cox. For us, the day with Ken was all about journeys—within and without. On our own shared journey, it was the first time in over twenty years as a couple that we attended a “professional development” event together. You see, one of us works as a teacher/counsellor and the other as a computer systems architect. We

have often smiled at the differences in our *outside* lives. Yet, only after we had matured in our relationship did the interdependence of our *inside* lives become apparent to us both. We have since become conscious contributors to one another's growth.

The day was rich with stories that we could both relate to—because of our individual lives and because of the life we share together. Ken shared, so truth-

fully, the reality of his life's work as a manifestation of his inner world. It was fascinating to see that such a left-brain endeavour as work on the Apollo Mission was informed by holistic, right-brain perspectives of hope, care, and humour. Ken's message was that sometimes we can only understand what we are doing when we step back and reflect—as the astronauts did on their way home. It was then that they were able to see *one* world and *one* mission—to steward the one

world into the future. For us the central invitation of the day with Ken may have been to see, to reflect, to celebrate, and to commit to stewardship of our world through the expression of our Selves in our daily endeavours.

So, we came away smiling. We were inspired to continue to travel with trust in one another and faith in human kind, and we had renewed optimism for the future.

## Singapore: Advanced Residential Training Program — by Wendy Lum

As I reflect on my trip to Singapore, I am filled with gratitude for the wonderful experience and opportunity to travel overseas with the Satir Model. Cecilia and Agnes Ee warmly welcomed me into their peaceful home prior to the training. So wonderful to reconnect with Susan Chia (training assistant) and Warren Tan. It was exciting to meet the 30 participants, 3 Singapore interns (Warren, Agnes, Gilbert Fan), and 2 members from the Singapore Institute. The group consisted of therapists, psychiatrists, psychologists, university professors, and social workers. They were from Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, USA, and Canada. Enthusiastic responses from the participants filtered throughout the room during the week. The days and evenings were filled with teachings, dyad sharing, triad practices, and group debriefings. I

found out that the three main models of therapy in Singapore are narrative, solution-focused, and Satir!

It was wonderful to have a totally Asian experience, having fluctuated throughout my life in experiencing myself as a Chinese Canadian—externally looking Asian and internally experiencing myself as Canadian. This trip helped me to continue exploring my Asian-ness inside and outside.

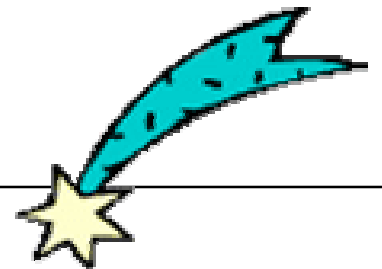
I had the pleasure to meet with Bee Lian Ang, the Director of the Rehabilitation and Protection Division in the Ministry of Community Development and Sports (MCDS). She observed a live therapy demonstration session between John and a mother and son, and was very enthusiastic about applications of the Satir Model. Also, I was able to teach Satir concepts in a

one-day workshop to approximately 70-80 MCDS staff members: probation officers, social workers (child protection, family violence), residential group home workers, counsellors, and administrative staff. The response was very positive!

A truly touching event occurred when John was honored as our “*Living Treasure*”—an initiative from Avanta. Susan lead us through the ceremony, sharing words of warmth, reverence, and love. In the centre of the room was a large candle held up by three bowls of water. All the participants sat in a large circle surrounding the bowls. John was asked to light the center candle. Then, each participant lit a candle from the centre candle and placed it in one of the bowls. Fourteen candles represented the countries in the world that John has taught the Satir Model. Each

participant spoke one word (i.e., hope, freedom, peace, courage, etc.) and shared their personal impact of John's teachings. Songs were sung, transcribed with Satir words—how clever of Anna Low! Also, a beautiful hand painted batik screen representing the “I Am” was unveiled for John, while a white pearl necklace was gifted to Kathlyne in appreciation for supporting John to teach throughout Asia. Appreciation, love, respect, and reverence filled the entire room. It was such a touching ceremony.

Before, I knew how fortunate we are to have John and Kathlyne here in Vancouver, but now I truly know.

## Avanta Advanced Residential Training Program – by Sue Taylor

Kathleen expertly and patiently went through a "parts party" and "the ingredients of an interaction," showing us how powerful these tools can be.

We formed triads and practiced being the therapist, client, and observer. Our homework often lasted well into the night, and by the end of the week we were all glad to have a night off. Ten of us shared a wonderful seafood meal at a restaurant in White Rock. We were amazed that the owner was a German Jew, who, when he heard He-

brew being spoken, followed us out onto the sidewalk as we left and insisted on kissing as many of the women as possible!

At the closing ceremony, when we were presented with our certificates, we all said a few words. As my name starts with a T, I thought that I would have little left to say. I don't remember what I did say, but I do remember getting quite tearful. Goodbyes have always been difficult for me but I know that the new friends I made and the old friends I was reunited with will always be a part of the Satir family which I cherish.

## Avanta Advanced Residential Training Program – by Kathy Wyse

This was the first residential Satir workshop that I have attended. It was an amazing experience for me! Much learning, growth, and love.

I had never had an opportunity to be with a group of people from such diverse cultures before. I believe that nine countries were represented. I cer-

## Resource Corner — by Mary-Ann Reid

Suhd, M., Dodson, L., & Gomori, M. (2000). Virginia Satir: Her life and circle of influence. Palo Alto, CA: Science and Behavior Books.

This is a deeply moving book about the life of Virginia Satir and the impact of her life and work throughout the world. It is the first volume of a series to be published, and is written by 10 of Satir's close colleagues. Satir helped to pioneer the field of family therapy. She was also an educator and a visionary and influenced many sectors of society, including government. Each chapter of this book is written by one or more authors, and expresses who Satir was as a person and as a professional. I find myself wanting to recommend this book to everyone. The authors have given their audience a gift; this book is yet one more of Satir's vehicles for change.

## Singapore: Advanced Residential Training Program — by Sandy Ang

From July 1–7, 2002, I attended the Advanced Residential Training Program offered by the Singapore Satir Centre. I joined over thirty professionals from Singapore, Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Thailand, USA, and Canada in shared learning, laughter, challenges, and ideas. As well, it was a chance to get together with old friends and to meet many new and inspiring colleagues.

I was initially anxious about the week-long event coming at a time of low energy for me. It required lengthy flights, and experience told me that Satir residential trainings were not to be confused with holidays. My concerns were quickly laid. The conference, held at the Salvation Army Conference Center Singapore, was a beautifully organized event. Starting with the Satir Singapore member who picked me up at Changi airport, the organization committee worked very hard to ensure that our needs (and many of our wants) were taken care of. Attention to detail was obvious. We were nurtured with food (many new and exciting tastes), Tai Chi in the morning by the pool, Chi machines delivered to our rooms, music and singing, and even a late night fortune telling by a Catholic Nun using Angel cards. Yes we did work hard. Yes we put in long hours. Yet the hard work and long hours

were balanced by the excitement of connecting with such amazingly diverse and talented individuals, and finding that we had so many similarities.



The creativity in how the Satir Model was being integrated in a variety of work settings was inspiring, as was the attendance of senior government and ministry officials at John's family therapy demonstration. The Satir Model is clearly receiving recognition and is being embraced in the Asian countries represented at the conference.

I especially enjoyed the use of metaphor throughout the program, from the opening ceremony's *yarn mandala* (symbolizing connectedness), the candle lighting ceremony at John's "Living Treasure" Celebration, to our closing event in which we gathered our growth seeds.

A special highlight of my week was being hosted by Gilbert of the Satir Institute of Singapore to a tour of Singapore's Chinatown and Little India. We began by going to the top of "Bukit Timah" for a view of this ultra modern, ultra organized, lushly tropical city. We visited Chinatown for shopping and a delicious traditional "herbal" meal, then on to Little India for more shopping and eating.

The energy, thoughtfulness and commitment to the Satir Model demonstrated by our hosts, the Singapore Satir Centre, and the participants of July's weeklong residential was contagious. I was reminded why these opportunities for training are so important to me for rejuvenation, inspiration, and deepening my learning. Thank you to John and Kathlyne for all your hard work in offering the training. Thank you to the Satir Institute of Singapore for the tremendously well organized event, and thank you to the Satir Institute of the Pacific for the bursary that helped me to attend.

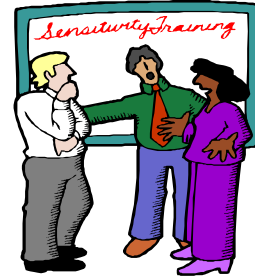

## Supervision Sessions

With Dr. John Banmen

### Group Supervision:

The main goal of supervision is to improve the therapeutic competence of the therapist working on change therapy. Case presentations will be the main avenue of learning. Therapeutic issues will be covered as they arise (eg: handling depression, resistance, anger, ethics, etc.). Audio and video tapes will be used for detailed process study. Also, group members will be required to meet for 2 hours in dyads between group sessions. Groups consist of six or fewer members. The cost of group supervision is \$200 for 4 sessions of 3 hours each.

### Individual Supervision:
