Expanding My Horizons

23rd World Family Therapy Conference in Malaysia

It is by chance that I was invited to attend the 23rd world family therapy conference held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on March 11-14, 2015. This three-day conference became an eye-opening and world-expanding experience for me. Seemingly, I am standing on the top of the mountain and close to the blue sky and white clouds overseeing the faraway ground below, whereas I used to perceive myself as a small busy ant walking through life in my own world. Now I am able to see the big picture of the development of world family therapy and what people from other countries are doing in family therapy.

On the first day, John Banmen gave a live demonstration using the Satir model with a Chinese client in front of around two hundred professionals in the late afternoon. I was acting as the translator for this session. I have to admit that I really appreciate John's courage and faith. I don't think many therapists are able to do this in front of many people, especially in front of professionals in the world congress. The



individual case went smoothly and it was a good demo. **Jo**l

On the third day, Kathlyne Banmen gave a speech on the essence of therapeutic change. I like that Kathlyne designed an experiential exercise for several hundred people to take part in at the same time. I felt differently inside when I did the hand exercise with my neighbor. When all the people went inside themselves it demonstrated the power and beauty of the Satir model.

In addition, Anna Low Maria from Singapore also presented "peace within, peace between, and

peace among" and several Hong Kong professors and counsellors from Universities who used to be John Banmen's students also presented their new findings in their work. I also went to a panel discussion when Kathlyne (Canada), Anna Low Maria (Singapore), and Sibel Erenel (Turkey) were presenting the similarities and differences in family therapy in different cultures using the Satir Model.

Family therapy development in Asia

It was very interesting to attend the sharing report by four representatives from Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Japan. They shared their experience of family therapy practice, training and research issues in their social context, and discussed directions for the future. At the end of report I asked Dr Wai-Yung Lee a question about their views of the development of family therapy in China. She said that Chinese families are very similar to Korean families and the developing stage and situation is also very similar.

Many Chinese people started doing family therapy out of interest but they are not committed to it yet. When she went to Shanghai five or six families were waiting in line. However she could only see one family per day. She also mentioned that more and more foreign experts in family therapy would be going to China in the near future.

Later on I checked out the research on family therapy in Korea by Young-ju Chun (PhD) from Silla University. She mentioned that face-saving, hierarchy, conformity, enmeshed boundaries, reactivity, we-ness (collectivism), and idiosyncratic emotions are cultural ingredients in Korean family therapy. I can identify that face-saving, hierarchy, enmeshed boundaries and so on are also some common issues in Chinese families from my personal perspective. I am full of curiosity and concern about how family therapy in China will develop and evolve in the near future. In the past ten years Maria Gormoria and John Banmen have been very committed to helping the Chinese develop family therapy using the Satir Model. Personally I am full of appreciation for their hard work, commitment, and contributions to my country.

Two mainland Chinese present Satir model therapy application in Chinese

It was a very surprising delight to see two mainland Chinese, Sharon Deng and Qiang Wang,

from John Banmen's TTT class, present two topics on keeping connection and support with separating family, and helping students achieve more success in Chinese Gaokao (the university entrance exam) using the Satir Model. These two topics are very common in China. Many family members move to other cities or immigrate to cities from the countryside because of drastic economic development



differences that influence family connection and marriage.

On the other hand, going to a good university equals a good life. This belief is imprinted in many parents' mind. This causes a lot of pressure on teenagers and leads to more Kaogao students in depression, addictions, and suicidal cases. This is first time to have two mainland Chinese present in the world family congress and it casts a new light on the future development of family therapy in China to the world platform.

At the end of congress I met the general secretary of the International Family Therapy Association, William Hiebert who told me that he had been making efforts to hold the congress in China in the past two years and it is very likely that the conference will be held in Macau in 2018. I am inspired by this news.

I heard from Anna Low Maria that Virginia Satir used to be the chairperson of this association many years ago. If she were still alive I wonder what she would say about this conference? Maybe she would say "we all are connected in our sameness and grow through our differences." Maybe she would just smile and smile ...
